UPDATES FROM THE CLASSES

Year 6

On Tuesday 28th January year 6 had the grand opening of their new reading hub. The parents of the year 6 children came in to talk about how we were getting on with our reading. We organised a performance to inform the mums and dads about the way we are reading in year 6. We introduced the Pawsome Reading Gang, who are dogs which each represent a different domain of reading, like Rex Retriever and Predicting Pip. These are two of the many different dogs which helps us in reading. Also, we notified the parents on our Reciprocal Reading groups, that we were sorted into, where we each have different roles, this changes every session. There is the Leader, who is in charge of the group, sorts out the roles. There is the Clarifier, Summariser, Visualizer, Questioner, Predictor and Evaluator. Another thing that we introduced was our new Reading Record books. We changed to these because we realised that year 6 are reading the same kind of books. Using these books we can record the genres of books we read by colouring a certain colour on a bar chart for each week. Also we can record how long we read each text. We are enjoying are reading this term and we are really keen to do more reading.
