Laptops for remote education:

During the lockdown, we made our stock of laptop/surface devices available for parents to borrow to access online learning. We've said to keep hold of those at the moment. We shared a link for parents to complete a form if they still needed a device before the summer holidays, so we could allocate one of our school devices to you. There's been very little response. Before we allocate, I am doing a final call...

If you don't have a device that your child can use to access home learning in the event of isolation or bubble closure, we will make what we have available for free loan. This also applies if you don't have enough devices for each child you have at St Peter's. If this is you, complete this form <u>here</u>.

We want to allocate devices now, so we are not rushing to do this should isolation or bubble closure have to take place – however, it will depend on demand and we'll prioritise those families without appropriate devices or with the fewest devices. Parents need to be aware that the devices we supply have to be logged in with a pupil username and password and that there is tracking and monitoring software on the device as they remotely connect to our Telford and Wrekin network. They cannot be used online without going through this network and they are only for our pupil use.

We cannot help with proving internet connections I'm afraid.

The form will be open until Thursday next week (15th October).

Parking:

As some of you will be aware, parking enforcement visited Squirrel Meadow earlier this week. I am told they are likely to visit again in the near future and look at the surrounding streets.

Holiday club October Half-term:

In last week's newsletter, I advised that I was trying to get some more advice and that you should assume there will be no holiday club for October half-term. I can now confirm that I have taken a final decision on this and we will not be offering care for this holiday.
