UPDATES AND INFORMATION

Informing us of positive coronavirus tests:

If your child tests positive for coronavirus up to and including Tuesday 6th April, please let us know by emailing stpetersholidaycovid@gmail.com We can then work with track and trace to see if there is an impact on other pupils or staff. Positive tests after this date should not impact on school bubbles and you don't need to inform us.

Consultation on Relationships and Sex Education:

You may be aware through the media that schools across England are rewriting their policies on what is taught in Relationships and Sex Education, following new government guidance. This was all due to come into effect in September 2020 but was extended to September 2021 due to the pandemic. The title can be

a little off putting but essentially what this is about is children knowing about their body, the changes that happen to them as they go into puberty, that their body is their own body and how a baby is made.

We have put together a plan of how this will look at St Peter's from September 2021 and we are now asking you for your views. Attached is the draft policy and included in it is an overview of what would be covered in each year group. In putting this together, we have used guidance from the Department for Education, training and information from the PSHE (Personal Social and Health Education) Association and guidance from the Church of England.

In our plan we have also shared what elements parents can withdraw their children from. These are the non-statutory elements, marked in red.

Returning Laptops and Devices Reminder:

We will quarantine the devices once they are returned and they will be serviced by our IT technician as soon as possible.

Should we end up in a position where we must close a bubble, we will make devices and routers available to borrow again.
