



Family Learning










We have had a fantastic start to school in Reception this week! The children have settled in amazingly and made lots of new friends! We all looked very smart in our new uniforms ©

We had lots of fun playing with clubs' toys and using our imaginations, with the wooden blocks, Lego, magnets, playdough, cars, action figures and the barbies.



Wraparound Reminders

- If your child is being collected by someone other than the person with parental responsibility, like a grandparent or other parents etc then we need permission from the parent before we can let the child go with someone else, this can be via email or upon drop off in the morning.
- If your child is booked onto a day of holiday club and they will no longer be attending
 then please let us know before 9am the day of the session if you can, as we do baking
 in the morning so if they arrive after baking is done, they may miss out on taking
 baking home.
- Please when dropping off your child in the morning that you refrain from pressing the buzzer until 8:30am as we are not insured until then to let children into the building.
- Also, can you ensure that an adult is walking the child up through the gates to club,
 please don't drop them off at the bottom gates and send them up alone.
- If your child is being picked up early, then let a member of staff know during drop off.
- Your child is more than welcome to bring their own toy from home to club, but we do reiterate that it is their responsibility to look after any toys they bring.
- Bikes and scooters can also be brought to holiday club but again it is the child's
 responsibility to look after it and their helmet, they can be left here at club during
 the week as all the gates and locked and secured.
- Bookings for October Half term are live on MCAS to book now, this includes a PD Day Friday October 24th. Bookings for this close on October 17th 6pm, we cannot accept any late bookings.
