










Parents Math Sessions


Reception Parents you will have received a letter about our Career Day on 11th February. As part of their community topic in Spring Term we will be learning about different job roles within our community.

We would like to congratulate all the children on a wonderful nativity last week (3) Thank you for your hard work and brilliant performances!



Year 1 Week beginning: 15th December 2025

Year 1 had an exciting visit to RAF Cosford to support their learning about the history of transport. During the trip, the children explored real aircrafts to learn how transport has changed over time. A highlight of the day was getting to sit inside a real aircraft cockpit, which helped pupils imagine what it was like to be a pilot. They also enjoyed trying on pieces of pilot uniform, giving them a hands-on understanding of the equipment used in the past. The visit brought their history topic to life and encouraged curiosity through observation, questioning and practical exploration.
