

On Saturday 14 March, the Shropshire Schools Y5 and Y6 Cross Country Championships took place at Concord College.

In the Y5 race, Arlo, Harley and Noah represented St Peter's. They did a fabulous job, and despite only having three runners (top four finishers per school/club count for team score), they finished as 5th team overall. This is a really strong foundation to build on and, hopefully, they will all return to run again next year.

Seven boys lined up for the Y6 race. A fantastic run from George earned him 9th place individually. Strong performances from Max, Charlie, Harry, Dilan, Reuben and Vihaan saw the team finish in 3rd place overall. Even more impressively, the St Peter's team was actually the highest placed school team, with the top two teams being from running clubs. A brilliant effort, well done boys!

Following the Y5 and Y6 races, a fun run was held for children in Y3 and Y4. St Peter's had representation here too, with Paige proudly flying the flag for the girls and Toby finishing an excellent 2nd place overall. Well done to both of them!

All of the children did St Peter's proud, supporting one another, showing great determination, and battling through some very muddy conditions. This is a friendly, relaxed event and a wonderful chance to represent the school. We'd love to see even more children taking part next year in both the boys' and girls' races.

Following the brilliant running from the St Peter's Team at the Shropshire U11's Cross Country Championships on Saturday, which resulted in a Bronze team medal, George has now been invited to represent Shropshire at the Primary National Cross Country Finals, next Saturday at Stoneleigh in Warwickshire.

Following on from our science unit about evolution, we explored Shrewsbury and all the places linked to Charles Darwin across the town. The trail took us from Frankwell to Mardol, Dog Pole and the library all the way up to St Chad's church at the top of the Quarry. We got to see the places that he went to school, worshipped and spent his spare time. During the day, we also visited the Museum and Art Gallery in the square. The museum was fantastic and the children explored a variety of time periods and artefacts, including fossils that were found in Shropshire from when it was covered in sea! There were some amazing pieces and the children found, read and listened to the information attentively.


