Year 3

This week in Year 3 we have been continuing our work on George's Marvellous Medicine. We have been thinking more about the main characters- George and Grandma- and trying to understand their motives for their actions in the story. To help us with this, we practised writing questions and then also had fun taking on the role of each character in a hot seating activity.



Also, in Bratton 7's history lesson this week, we learnt about trade in Ancient Egypt and Mesopotamia and the children got to practise being traders and learning how to trade to get supplies to help them survive. There were some very good haggling skills in class!



In science this week Bratton 8 have investigated different seed pods and learnt how different plants spread their seeds in a variety of ways.





Gurdwara Trip

Year 4 enjoyed a fantastic trip to Telford Gurdwara just before half term. The Gurdwara and coach driver both commented that children were very well behaved and respectful. Children were able to enjoy eating the Langar offered and ask many thoughtful and interesting questions about Sikhism linked to their learning in RE.





History/ Art

We have now started our new history unit - Anglo Saxons. This also links to Art as we are looking at the design of Anglo Saxon crosses. We have so far looked at artefacts, designs and learnt about what was found at Sutton Hoo, Suffolk.

Maths

Since half term we have been learning about and identifying different types of angles, triangles and quadrilaterals. Why not ask children to share their knowledge with you. Can you identify these angles?



We have now completed the government Multiplication Tables Check. Ongoing practise of times tables will help children to recall and use these facts when working on maths in year 5.
