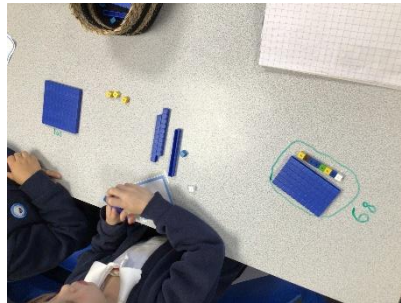
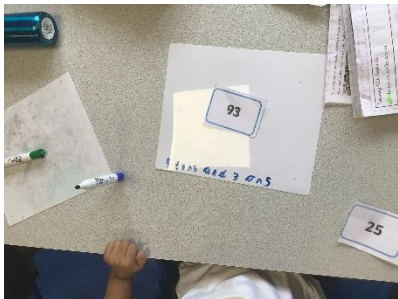

Welcome to Year 2



Maths

This week we had started our Place Value unit. The children have loved getting stuck into the different maths stations. We have focussed on building our numbers, developing our understanding tens and ones.



English

Our current text is 'The Disgusting Sandwich'. This week we have been immersing ourselves into the text. We have mimed the story, read with expression and sequenced the story. The children loved using plasticine to re-create parts of the story.



Geography

We began our unit 'The Poles and the Equator' unit. The children have been keen to learn more about the Arctic and Antarctic. We listened to songs and looked at where the North Pole, South Pole and the equator are in the world. We then took our learning outdoors to re-create the world in pairs using chalk.



Note for parents

Spelling books

Please can you make sure your child brings their orange spelling book **every Monday**. We will do our spelling test in the back of the book so that you can see how your child is getting on. Please practice the spellings separately to the book as they fill up quickly.

Changing reading books

Your child is welcome to change their reading book as frequently as they wish. We do not have a set day to change books. We have advised that the best time for them to do this is when they arrive at school in the morning, or when we are getting our home time things at the end of the day.

Year 3

We have had an amazing week in Year 3 and have settled well into our weekly timetable now assessments are out of the way!

In English, we have been focusing on 'Little Red Riding Hood' and have developed our reading skills through practicing how to read aloud with expression. The children worked in pairs or small groups when reading aloud and ensured they included hand gestures and facial expressions.



In Maths, we have continued with 'Place Value'. This week we focused on identifying the value of each digit in three-digit numbers and how to represent these using manipulatives and part-whole models.

Throughout our foundation subjects, the children have participated well and shown engagement during exciting lessons. In Science, we investigated reflections and used various materials to explore if shining a torch on them created a reflection. Bratton 7 and Bratton 8 then used their knowledge of this to design a schoolbag bag, explaining their chosen material and how this would help to keep us safe when walking to and from school.

During our RE lesson, children learnt about 'The Creation Story' and what God did over the seven days. Children enjoyed acting out each day and then wrote sentences to explain what happened.
