A few Wraparound Reminders

- Please can children not bring their own toys from home to before and after school club, children who attend holiday club can still bring in a small toy with them from home.
- Please can parents ensure they are closing the gate behind them when coming in and out of club. Please wait at the gate, press the buzzer and wait for a member of staff to let you through rather than walking through an already open gate, this is just so staff are aware whose parents are here and who is on club site.

English

We are really excited about our new topic in English, which links to our history unit about the Stone Age. We have been exploring a variety of non-fiction texts and collated lots of information. This will help us, when next week we are working in pairs to create a class information book about the Stone Age.



Science

In science, this week we have exploring how shadows are formed. We first watched a video about a Lion King Theatre performance using shadow puppets. Then, we had a go ourselves at making our own puppets and used torches to create a puppet show.







During our hockey sessions, we have been focussing on our control, dribble and pass techniques, in a selection of activities. By working in groups, we have also developed our teamwork and communication skills by encouraging and supporting each other and listening to each other's ideas.







Also, thank you to the friends for our baubles, we have been painting and decorating them this week and getting excited for Christmas!








Year 4 have had an extremely busy half term so far. We have been writing our own versions of Frindleswylde by Natalia and Lauren O'Hara, applying our multiplication knowledge in maths and investigating sources of sound.

In art we have been learning how to draw in the style of Manga. We are now creating our own comics, which we will share with our grown ups at home. We have really enjoyed learning the techniques associated with this style.









Earlier in the week, we took part in a Greek wow afternoon to find out what the Ancient Greeks have done for us. We took part in Olympic events, deciphered the Greek alphabet, acted out myths and produced our own ostracon. Through our learning, we have also uncovered evidence from historical sources and discovered the difference between the city states of Athens and Sparta.





Next term we are looking forward to finding out what happened after the Roman invasion and have a trip to Wroxeter booked and a virtual tour of The British Museum.


