

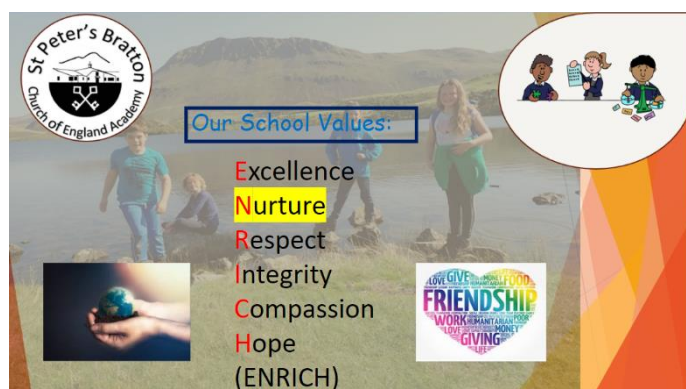


NEWSLETTER

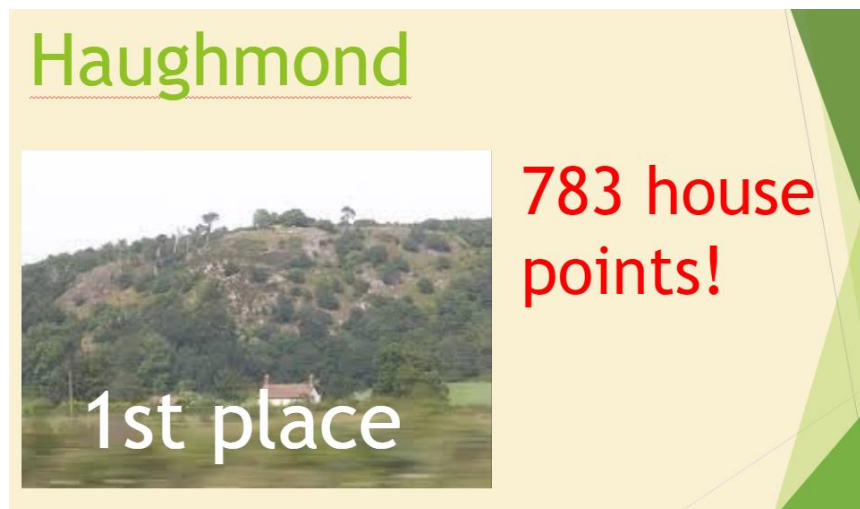

You are welcome to visit our school on Friday 15th November 2024. Please contact the school office on 01952 387980 and book onto a session, time slots available are: 9.30-10.30am or 1:30-2:30pm.

- You **must** apply if your child was born before 1st September 2020-31st August 2021
- You **must** apply even if your child is attending a nursery or pre-school on a school site or you have a child already attending the school
- You are advised to list four schools on your application form, including your catchment area/nearest school.
- Attending a nursery does **not** guarantee a school place
- School places are allocated in line with oversubscription criteria.
- If a child has an Education, Health and Care Plan the closing date is the 31st October 2024 for applications. Please contact school to speak to our school SENDCO.
- School places are allocated in line with over subscription criteria.

Happy Diwali



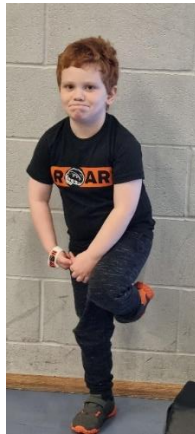

We have started our computing topic—Branching and databases. We had fun making up yes or no questions to group and identify objects, like a computer.

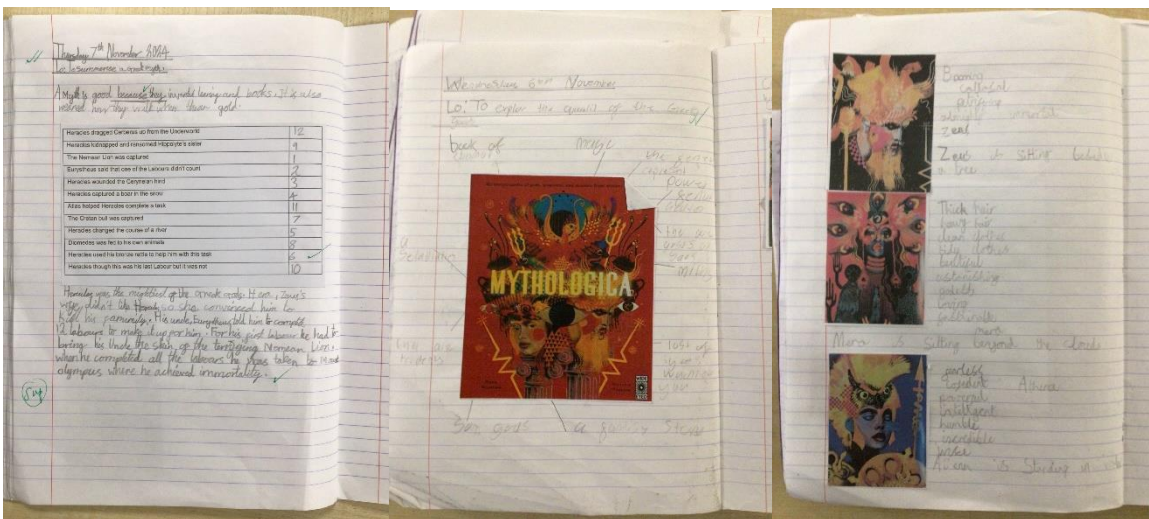




This week Year 4 have started our theme for this half term of Ancient Greece.

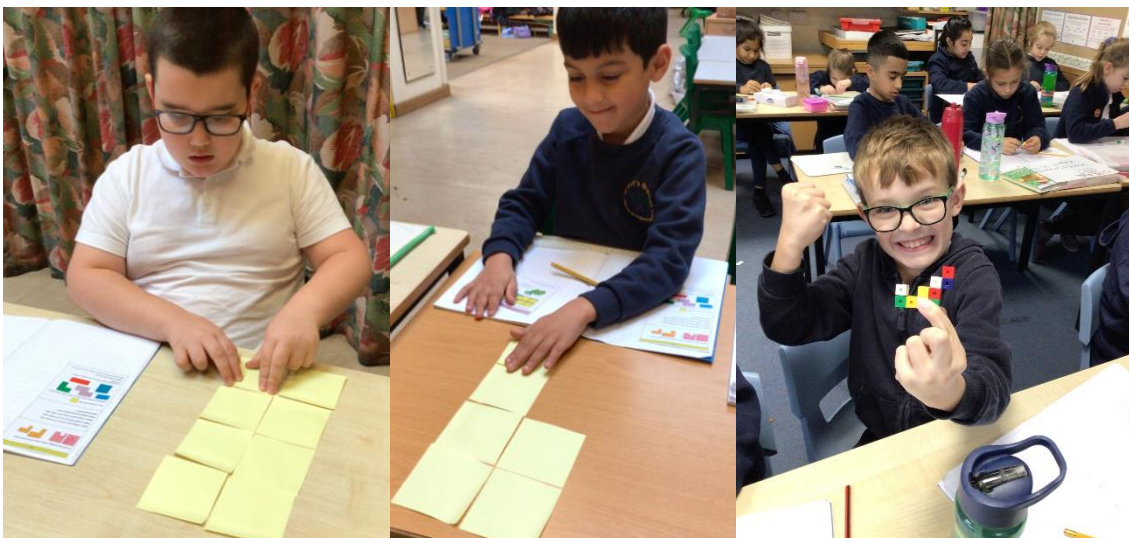
English
