We especially want to thank you for sending your son Jesus to die on the cross and save our sins.

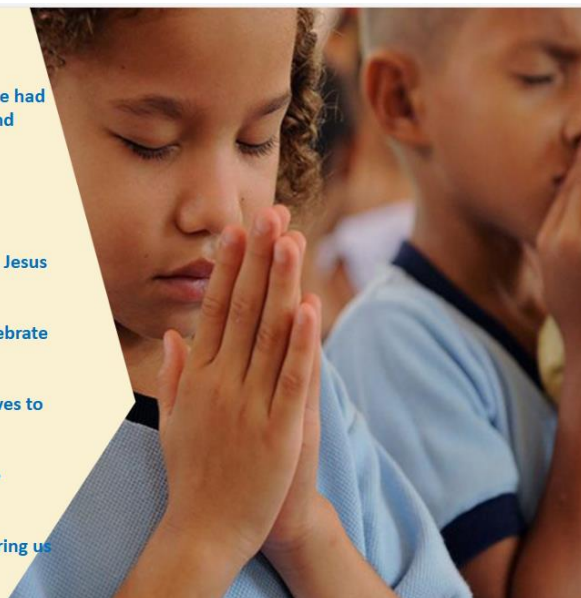
We pray for Mrs Pugh's friends and family as they celebrate the life of such a wonderful lady.

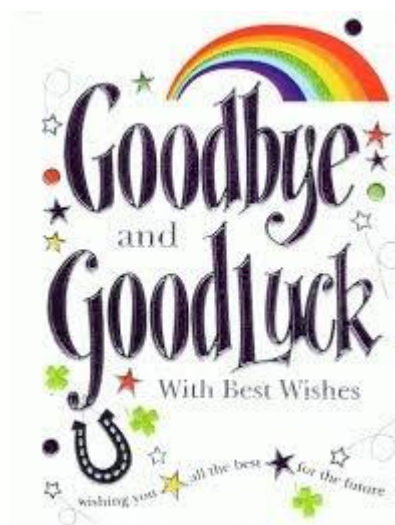
