



Amen.







Following this, there was an amazing presentation by Ercall Wood staff showing just how exciting and amazing science is- with more bangs and even fire! This was a super opportunity for children in year 6 to see what life is like in secondary school and see the kind of activities they will be able to complete in science labs. 
All children attending the disco (excluding Reception) will need to be collected from school by their adult and taken to the disco.

Unfortunately, we are unable to collect and return children to wrap around care. You will need to make arrangements direct with them yourselves for your children.

A tuck shop will be available in the disco for children to purchase goodies from. Reception parents, we will sell tuck after the disco on the reception playground, so your children won't have to handle money. Refreshments will be provided in the year 5 & 6 wing for the adults wishing to wait for their children during the disco.



Our Family Quiz Night will be an evening of light-hearted family fun where the school community can come together and get to know one another.
