School Reports



As we approach the end of another successful school year, school reports will be available to view on MCAS, and you will also receive a letter confirming your child's class teacher for next year. We are pleased that our new members of staff will be attending both transition days and the Meet the Teacher session, providing an opportunity for children and families to begin building those important relationships ahead of September.

Reading through the reports has been a real privilege. I am incredibly proud of the positive comments they contain and of the progress each child has made throughout the year, both academically and personally. The growth in confidence, resilience and independence across the school has been remarkable. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank our dedicated staff team for their hard work, commitment and unwavering support of our school values. Their passion and care help to make St Peter's Bratton such a special place for our children to learn and thrive.

In addition to this:

Year 1- Phonics Check Results will be on MCAS.

Year 2- Phonics Check results will be on MCAS (only children who have re-taken their phonics check)

Year 4- Multiplication Check score will be on your child's annual report.

Year 6- We have received notification today that the SATS results are delayed- see below. We will share the results with you as soon as we can process them.

SATs Results

You may have seen recent news reports regarding a delay to this year's Key Stage 2 (KS2) test results.

I am writing to inform you that this delay affects all schools nationally. Schools were originally due to receive KS2 results on 7 July 2026. However, Pearson Education Limited, the organisation responsible for administering, marking and returning KS2 results, has informed the Department for Education that there is a delay affecting the national system used to make results available to schools. As a result, schools will now receive results on 16 July 2026.

We understand that this news may be frustrating for parents and pupils, and we share that disappointment. However, please be assured that this will not detract from celebrating everything that our Year 6 children have achieved during their time at primary school.

Importantly, the delay is not related to the quality of the tests or the accuracy of pupils' results. Test papers have been marked in line with the usual processes and procedures.

This delay will not affect your child's transition to secondary school, and no action is required from parents or pupils. We will share your child's results with you as soon as possible after we receive them on 16 July.

Thank you for your patience and understanding. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the school office.

Transition



To support a smooth transition into the next academic year, we have planned two transition mornings next week. We know that moving to a new class is an important milestone for children and can bring a mixture of excitement and nervousness. These sessions will help children become familiar with their new classroom, teacher and routines, helping them to feel more confident and settled before the summer break. Staff have worked closely together to ensure all children are supported and that their new teachers have a thorough understanding of their strengths, achievements and individual needs.

Transition Arrangements:

- **Tuesday 7th July, 9:30–10:30am:** Children will move to their new classroom and spend time meeting their new teacher.
- **Wednesday 8th July, morning until 11:30am:** Children will enter school through their new classroom door and spend the morning with their new teacher.

We are confident that these opportunities will help children feel excited and ready for the next stage of their learning journey.

YEAR TWO

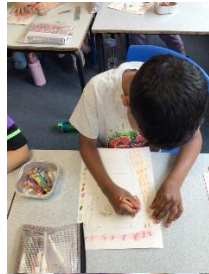
Computing

In Computing, we have been learning about digital photography and experimenting with using the camera in a landscape or portrait position. We also learned how to edit a photo and change the colour on the computer.



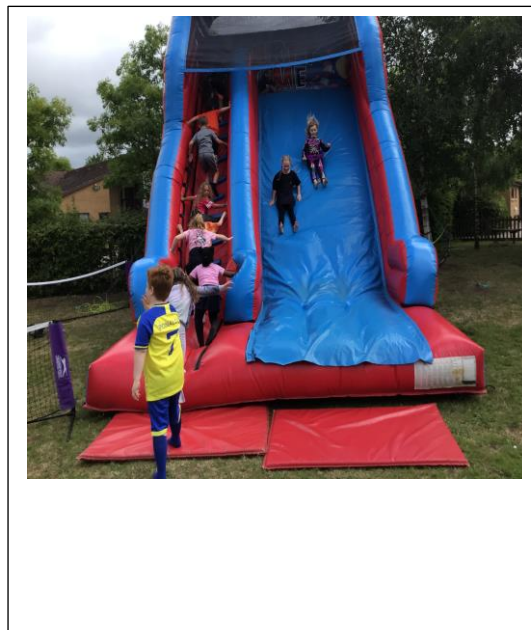
Artist Day

If art all day wasn't enough excitement we also had a very enjoyable hour trying out the different bouncy castles. I think the children thought they wished every day could be like this.

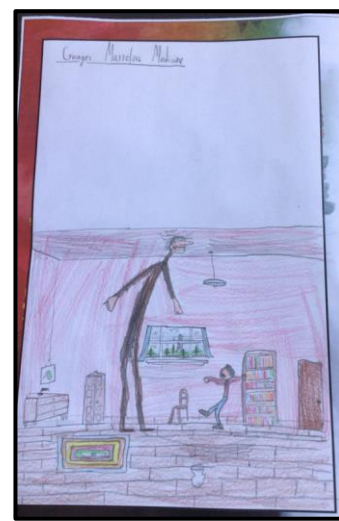
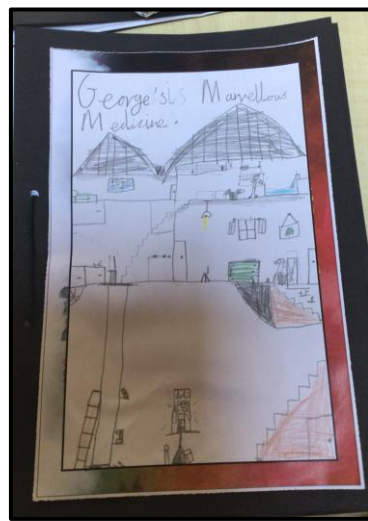
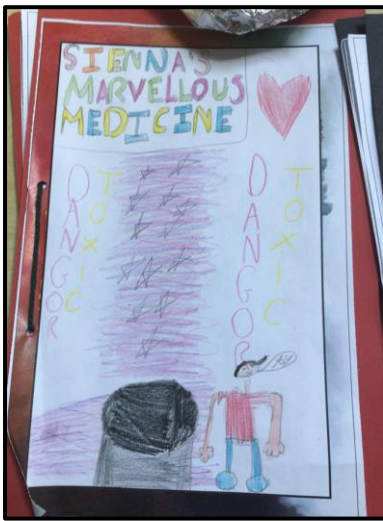


Year 3

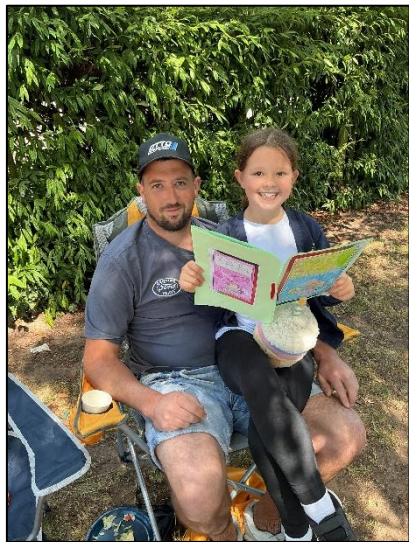
